Breaktime Snacks and Packed Lunches

Can I please remind you parents/guardians that we aspire to be a 'healthy school' and we are certainly a 'nut free' school as we have children with nut allergies. (This includes Nutella Chocolate Spread)

We are seeing increasing amounts of litter from plastic packaging on the playground and field every day. Please send your child with a snack of fruit/veg in its own wrapper, i.e. skin or in a reusable container. KS1 children are provided with fruit/veg daily that they can help themselves to. The plastic packaging we are seeing is from ultra-processed foods and sugary biscuits, such as Peperami, Cheese Dunkers, mini chocolate covered biscuits, etc. We then have the effects of sugar spikes and the lows that follow. This affects concentration, energy and behaviour. I'm not sure whether children are raiding their lunchboxes for a snack at breaktime, but please, if possible, send a healthy snack for them if they require
